Muench, Public Works Commission Administrator, City Council gave preliminary approval to the Public Works Commission to negotiate with Thompson and Barrett, a real estate development firm, for the extension of a water utility main outside the city limits to serve Holiday Park Subdivision on Owne Drive subject to the approval and adoption of the revised policy of utilities extensions outside the city by the Council.

On a motion by Councilman Plummer, seconded by Councilman Rhodes; the Council voted unanimously to approve a request by developers of Glendale Acres for paving of the streets in the subdivision by private contractor and for the city to participate to its usual extent in the cost of the street paving.

Upon motion by Councilman Rhodes, seconded by Councilman Maness, the Council voted unanimously to appoint Mr. Cecil Barefoot as Heating and Air Conditioning Inspector with the City Inspection Department.

A taxi driver permit application for Hugh Francis Mahoney was referred to the Chief of Police for review and approval. This was subsequently done and the application approved.
