

City Manager Ray then presented salary statistics to the Council to support the proposed pay plan which was prepared by Mr. Donald Haymon of the Institute of Government, U.N.C., and presented by him at an earlier meeting.

Councilman Rose moved that the pay plan be adopted as proposed effective January 1, 1962. Motion was seconded by Councilman Plummer and carried unanimously.


