

stated that he had also been contacted by telephone by Mr. I. A. Faucette, 2710 Pecan Drive who stated that he and a Mrs. Miller and several others who were unable to attend the meeting, were also opposed to the rezoning. A further poll of the audience by Mayor Butler revealed no persons present in favor of the rezoning.

Planning Director Rumbough stated that it was Planning Board's recommendation that the petition be denied.

Councilman Plummer then moved that the request be denied. Motion was seconded by Councilman Rhodes and unanimously carried.

A public hearing having been advertised, as required and there being no opposition present and on motion by Councilman Rose, seconded by Councilman Maness, the Council voted to amend the City's Zoning Ordinance as follows:

Rezone from R-5 Residential District to M-2 Industrial District an area on Robeson Street and Weiss Avenue described as follows:

BEGINNING at a point in the center line of Robeson Street approximately 100 feet northward from its intersection with the northern end of Weiss Ave. said point being a corner in the zoning boundary between the R-5 Residential District and M-2 Industrial District; and running thence with said boundary line in a southeasterly direction approximately 250 feet to a corner in said boundary line; and running thence with said boundary line in a southerly direction approximately 350 feet to the center of Blounts Creek; and running thence with the center of Blounts Creek in a southwestwardly direction approximately 1100 feet to the beginning.

Mr. Sneed High again presented a proposed amendment to the city's Taxicab Ordinance as relates to the transfer and assignment of Taxicab Certificates.

Mr. High spoke at length regarding the proposed amendment.

There was then considerable discussion by the Council of the city's method of issuance of certificates under it's present ordinance as weighed against the proposed amendment.

Councilman Plummer then moved for denial of the request for amendment and for more stringent enforcement of the city's Taxicab Ordinance as relates to certificates. His motion was seconded by Councilman Rhodes and Mayor Butler called for a vote.

The vote was as follows:

For the Motion: Councilmen Plummer, Rhodes and Maness.
Against the Motion: Mayor Butler and Councilman Rose.

Councilman Plummer moved that the low bid of \$2,558.00 made by Hyman Supply Company be accepted. The motion was seconded by Councilman Rose and approved.

Regulations governing public dances, which was left open at the November 13th meeting of the Council, was again discussed.

City Attorney Tally presented to the Council for Councilman Plummer and Councilman Maness, the Committee appointed by Mayor Butler to study the matter, their recommendation in the form of an ordinance.

Following a brief discussion, Councilman Plummer moved that the ordinance be adopted and that the hour in Section 3 of said ordinance be set at 12:00 midnight. Motion was seconded by Councilman Rose and the ordinance as follows was adopted.

AN ORDINANCE UPON DANCE HALLS and PUBLIC CONDUCT THEREAT and ELSEWHERE

The City Council of the City of Fayetteville, North Carolina, Does Ordain:

Section 1.

No person shall yell, shout, hoot, whistle, sing or make any kind of unnecessary noise upon any public street or at or in or near any dance hall or other place of public meeting or assembly or entertainment or at any place in the City, at any time, so as to annoy or disturb the quiet, comfort or repose of persons in any office, dwelling, hotel or other residence, or of any persons in the vicinity.

Section 2.

No person in the City shall disturb, tend to disturb, or aid in disturbing the peace of others by violent, tumultuous, offensive or obnoxious conduct, and no person shall knowingly permit such conduct upon any premises owned or possessed or rented by him or under his control.

Section 3.

No public dance within the City to which persons are admitted by the payment of money rather than upon invitation without payment of money shall be conducted and continued upon any night beyond the hour of 12:00.

Section 4.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption.

Upon motion by Councilman Plummer, seconded by Councilman Rhodes, final plat approval for Westshore Section of Forest Lakes, Block "D", was voted by the Council.

Councilman Rhodes then moved for final plat approval of Bordeaux, Section X, subject to the approval of the City Engineer and Public Works Commission and subject to annexation of the area to the city. Motion was seconded by Councilman Plummer and carried.

Motion was made by Councilman Plummer to advertise a public hearing at Council's regular meeting on January 22nd to annex to the city Lots 11, 12, 13 and 14, Block "N" and Lots 13 and 14, Block "K", of Section X, Bordeaux. Motion was seconded by Councilman Maness and approved.

Upon motion by Councilman Rhodes, seconded by Councilman Maness, the following Taxi Driver Permits were approved:
