1.0 CALL TO ORDER

5.0 OTHER ITEMS OF BUSINESS

5.01 City Council Agenda Item Request - Moratorium Request for Locks Creek Subdivision - Council Member Ingram

Council Member Ingram stated she is seeking approval from Council to direct staff to look into the Locks Creek Subdivision and surrounding areas flooding problems. Council Member Ingram also stated that homes in this area should never have been built.

Discussion ensued.

5.02 City Council Agenda Item Request - Request removal of Market House image from all City property.
