MOTION: Council Member Haire moved to approve the agenda with

moving Item 5.2 for presentation before Item 5.1.

VOTE: UNANIMOUS (10-0)

5.0 ITEMS OF BUSINESS

5.2 Market House Options and Direction to Staff

This item was moved for presentation before Item 5.1.

Mayor Colvin and Council members were provided a spreadsheet that listed the following four potential options for the Market House:

- Repurpose as a Museum/Center/Art Gallery focused on African-American history or culture;
- 2. Relocating the Market House;
- 3. Demolish the Market House; or
- 4. Leave as Status Quo.

Discussion ensued.

MOTION: Council Member Kinston moved to remove Option 4, Status Quo, from the list of Market House Options.

SECOND: Council Member Haire

VOTE: UNANIMOUS (10-0)

MOTION: Council Member Banks-McLaughlin moved to adopt Option 3,

Demolish the Market House.

SECOND: Council Member Kinston

VOTE: FAILED by a vote of 2 in favor to 8 in opposition (Council

Members Colvin, Jensen, Ingram, Waddell, Haire, Dawkins,

Davis, and Wright)

Discussion ensued.

MOTION: Council Member Waddell moved to hold a referendum in order

for the citizens to be heard; to vote on whether to

demolish the Market House or not.

SECOND: Council Member Kinston

VOTE: FAILED by a vote of 4 in favor to 6 in opposition (Council

Members Colvin, Jensen, Haire, Dawkins, Davis, and Wright)

Discussion ensued.

MOTION: Council Member Davis moved to direct staff to bring back

suggestions for Option 1, Repurposing the Market House, and Option 2, Relocating the Market House; estimated costs, timelines, and details, within the next 90 days. And to eliminate Option 3, Demolishing the Market House, and Option 4, Status Quo, from the Market House Options as

presented by staff.

SECOND: Council Member Dawkins

VOTE: PASSED by a vote of 6 in favor to 4 in opposition (Council

Members Ingram, Waddell, Banks-McLaughlin, and Kinston)

Mr. Douglas Hewett, City Manager, stated staff will engage professionals to identify how the Market House could be moved, and how the Market House could be repurposed for how it may look as a museum and will report back to Council on various game plans on a regular basis.

5.1 Market House Murals

Discussion ensued.

MOTION: Council Member Davis moved to replace the mural around the

Market House with the exact same wording as was originally placed; the mural to remain for a minimum of six months. Direct staff to bring back ideas and suggestions of where

to permanently locate the mural.

SECOND: Council Member Ingram

VOTE: PASSED by a vote of 8 in favor to 2 in opposition (Council

Members Waddell and Banks-McLaughlin)

Discussion ensued.
