Capital Project Ordinance (CPOA) 2024-2 will reduce the running Passenger Facility Charge (PFC) application by \$1,083,607.00 to reflect the approved Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) collections. In addition, the amended CPOA 2024-2 will appropriate an additional \$100.00 to AIP Grant 46, to correct the FY20-21 amendment. The combination of these actions will take the total project appropriation for the Part II Terminal Renovation Project from \$37,336,294.00 to \$36,252,787.00.

7.07 Adoption of Capital Project Ordinance 2024-2 to Appropriate Customer Facility Charges (CFCs) for Consolidated Rental Car Facility (CONRAC) Development

Customer Facility Charges (CFCs) are collected from users by rental car agencies at an airport. Collected funds are used exclusively for rental car-related capital improvement projects.

Capital Project Ordinance (CPO) 2024-2 will appropriate \$594,333.00 of CFC funds to support consultant services for the Design and Bidding package being completed by WK DICKSON & CO., Inc.

7.08 Adoption of Special Revenue Fund Project Ordinance 2024-4 to Appropriate Grant Awarded for the Cape Fear River Trail Expansion

The City has received notification of a state grant award from the NC Department of Natural and Cultural Resources (NC DNR). This grant in the amount of \$1,000,000.00 will support the expansion of the Cape Fear River Trail project. Staff is seeking authorization to accept the grant award and Council adoption of Special Revenue Fund Project Ordinance 2024-4 to appropriate the funding.

7.09 Adoption of Special Revenue Fund Project Ordinance 2024-6 for the FY24 Juvenile Restitution Program

The City has been awarded grant funding for fiscal year 2023-2024 for the Fayetteville-Cumberland County Juvenile Restitution Program. Council is asked to adopt Special Revenue Fund Project Ordinance 2024-6 to accept the grant funding and appropriate \$88,970.00 needed for personnel and operating costs for fiscal year 2023-2024. The funding sources for this program include a \$57,068.00 grant awarded by the North Carolina Department of Public Safety, a local match of \$15,951.00 from Cumberland County and the City's local match of \$15,951.00.

7.010 Request for Legal Representation of City Employee

The purpose of this agenda item is to receive authorization from the City Council to provide legal representation for City employee Deangelo Andrews in the matter of Ja'Lana Dunlap-Banks v. City of Fayetteville, Officer Ryan Haddock, Detective Amanda Bell, Sergeant Deangelo Andrews, and John and Jane Doe's 1-100, City of Fayetteville employees and police officers. The employee was acting within the scope and course of his employment with the City when the alleged incident(s) occurred.

7.012 Approval of the Amended Independent Auditor Contract for the Year Ended June 30, 2022

The City and PWC are required by North Carolina state statutes and granting agencies to have an annual audit and the Local Government Commission requires annual contracts.

The City's Finance-Purchasing Division prepared and advertised a request for proposals (RFP) for the selection of the independent auditor on February 10, 2021. Two proposals were received on March 2, 2021. The RFP is for three annual audits for the fiscal years ending June 30, 2021, June 30, 2022, and June 30, 2023. The Audit Committee recommended PBMares, LLP, and City Council approved PBMares, LLP.

7.013 Bid Recommendation - Resurface Various Streets 2024 - Phase I

Award and authorize the execution of a contract for Resurface Various Streets 2024 Phase I to Highland Paving, Company, LLC, Fayetteville, NC; the lowest responsive, responsible bidder, in the total amount of \$4,570,620.

7.014 Bid Recommendation - Primary Cable 750 MCM AL & Reject Bids for Primary Cable 10 AL

Award the bid for the purchase of Primary Cable 750 MCM AL to WESCO Distribution, Clayton, NC, and Border States Electric, Greensville, SC, the lowest responsive, responsible bidders, in the total amounts of \$1,210,770.00 and \$1,043,460.00, respectively and reject all bids for Primary Cable 1/0 AL.
