Mayor Clark called the meeting to order and asked the Rev. Thomas Fulk, Pastor of Trinity Baptist Church, to deliver the invocation.

Public hearing was held as advertised on the paving and improving of portions of McPherson Avenue, Murray Hill Road and the extension and paving of a portion of Skye Drive. No opposition was present regarding McPherson Avenue and Murray Hill Road. Mr. Fred Garvin of 2842 Skye Drive was opposed initially to the extension and paving of Skye Drive until the proposed route was explained to him and he then withdrew his objection. Thereafter, upon motion by Councilman Rhodes, seconded by Councilman Plummer, Council ordered by unanimous vote the paving of those portions of McPherson Avenue, Murray Hill Road and the extension and paving of a portion of Skye Drive as described in the following resolution:

FINAL RESOLUTION
REQUIRING THE PAVING,
WITHOUT A PETITION
OF
MCPHERSON AVENUE
SKYE DRIVE
AND
MURRAY HILL ROAD

After careful study and consideration of the matter and of all pertinent facts and circumstances, including engineering and planning studies and advice, and in the exercise of its best legislative judgment, the City Council of Fayetteville, North Carolina, finds as fact that:

1) McPherson Avenue is unsafe and dangerous;

and

1) The paving of Skye Drive is necessary in order to connect a portion of Skye Drive, already paved, to the City School Board property, and the paving of Murray Hill Road is necessary in order to connect the existing paving on Murray Hill Road to Brightwood Drive;

and

2) The RESOLUTION and ORDER adopted at its meeting on the 8th day of July, 1963, by the City Council of the City of Fayetteville, North Carolina, entitled "PRELIMINARY RESOLUTION REQUIRING THE PAVING, WITHOUT A PETITION, OF MCPHERSON AVENUE, SKYE DRIVE AND MURRAY HILL ROAD", having been duly published on the 10th day of July, 1963, in the Fayetteville Observer, a newspaper published in the City of Fayetteville, North Carolina, giving notice of a meeting of the City Council to be held on the 22nd day of July, 1963, at 8:00 P. M., in the Court Room at the City Hall of Fayetteville, North Carolina, when all objections to the legality of making the proposed improvements were to be made in writing, signed in person or by Attorney, filed with the Clerk of the City of Fayetteville, at or before said time, and that any such objections not so made would be waived, and objections to the legality, as well as to the policy or expediency, of the making of said improvements not having been filed or made;

and

The public interest, safety, convenience and general welfare requires the paving and other below described improvement of MCPHERSON AVENUE, SKYE DRIVE AND MURRAY HILL ROAD;

and

4) The property abutting on said Streets to be so paved and improved will be benefited by such pavement and improvement to the extent of the part of the cost thereof to be assessed, as stated below, against such abutting property;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAYETTEVILLE, NORTH CAROLINA, DOES ORDER THAT:
