7.01 Millennial Advisory Commission Initial Annual Report

Dr. Telly Whitfield, Assistant City Manager, introduced this item and stated the City of Fayetteville Millennial Advisory Commission (MAC) was established by the City Council in May 2019. This item is for the MAC to present its first Annual Report to the Council. (Originally anticipated in the Fall 2020, the presentation has been delayed due to COVID.)

The MAC is to advise Council on issues relevant to the attraction, retention and engagement of Fayetteville residents born between 1981 and 2000. The Commission is expected to dedicate to improving the quality of life for young adults by providing recommendations to policies, programs and actions consistent with Council's Strategic Goal 4 of making Fayetteville a "desirable place to live, work, and recreate" for this generation. The development of a young adult engagement program was a completed FY 20 Target for Action.

Ms. Kayla McLoughlin, Commission Chair, provided the presentation with the aid of a PowerPoint presentation and gave an overview of the following points: Main Goals and Objectives, Charges and Tasks, Summary of Accomplishments, Activities and Upcoming Events, Issues to Address, Recommendations to Council, and Requested Council Action.

9.01 Public Hearing for the Proposed Renaming of Cross Creek Park for Mayor Beth Finch

Mr. Douglas Hewett, City Manager, presented this item and stated City Council supported a Council Member Agenda Item Request from Mayor Pro Tem Jensen to rename the Cross Creek Park after former Mayor Beth Dall Finch. Council provided staff with consensus direction to refer the item to the Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission for its recommendation. The Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission endorsed the recommendation to name Cross Creek Park after former Mayor Finch at their February 2, 2021, meeting. Following City Council Policy 155.4, Naming of City Properties in Honor of Individuals, a public hearing is required for any public park facility that has been tentatively approved by the City/County Parks Advisory Commission. During the February 22, 2021, regular meeting, City Council set a public hearing on this item for March 8, 2021. The public hearing was legally noticed on March 1, 2021.

Discussion ensued.

10.0 OTHER ITEMS OF BUSINESS

10.01 Approval of Senior Center East Building Program and Design

Mr. Michael Gibson, Parks, Recreation and Maintenance Director, presented this item with the aid of a PowerPoint presentation and stated in 2015 a package of Parks & Recreation bond projects was developed for voter consideration. The package included several new projects as well as renovations to certain existing parks/facilities. Voters approved the package and work has been completed for a number of projects to date.

Two new senior centers were included in the Parks & Recreation Bond Referendum - one to serve residents across eastern neighborhoods and the other on the west. The location of the "Senior Center East" project is also intended to be a catalyst for additional economic development in the Murchison Road corridor. The City entered into a partner agreement with Fayetteville State University (FSU) in the effort to find a joint site where the two would share synergies in their respective buildings--one being the City's senior center and FSU's new Health and Wellness Center being the other--in a campus-like setting. City staff and FSU identified parcels along Washington Street near FSU for potential placement of these projects. Today, the desired parcels have been acquired by the City and FSU. Senior Center East will be built on the recombined parcel adjacent to the FSU Health and Wellness Center on the corner of Filter Plant Road and Murchison Road.

Staff has been working with SFL^+a architects to generate the Senior Center East Program and design includes multi-purpose rooms, restrooms, kitchen space, an office, fitness and dance exercise rooms, and a warm water pool. A parking lot, road, sidewalks, equipment, furniture, irrigation, and pole lighting will be included in the final project. Delaying approval of the Program and Design presented may result in a delay of the initiation of the planned bid process for these projects. Any delay to the project timeline may result in increased construction costs.

A Council approved CIP project is in place for Senior Center East and funds are scheduled to be appropriated in the amount of $\$6.2\ \text{million}.$
