Performance Measures

- 19. Council has expressed concern about several key performance measures (KPMs) reported in the budget document. As an example, the Development Services department has several measures that report timeliness within "established deadlines" without listing what the target period is (e.g. two days of receipt, 24 hours etc.). Questions were also posed about the validity/clarity of some measures of Economic and Business Development effectiveness (e.g. # of new commercial and retail enterprises located in the city, # of new jobs created). How will staff proceed with revising these measures?
 - A. The City's performance measurement system is still in its infancy, having just been introduced for the fiscal year 2015 budget process. The Strategy and Performance Analytics staff in the City Manager's Office is continuing to work with departments to refine and enhance performance measures. In 2014, the Data Analytics Team was created to: provide support and guidance with development of performance management metrics; recommend standards, benchmarks, and best practice to be used in the development of performance management metrics for purposes of uniformity in reporting; and, perform periodic audits of performance management metrics for completeness and accuracy. Council's feedback will be provided to the Data Analytics Team to be incorporated into the upcoming review and audit of performance measures.

Economic and Business Development

- 21. On page E-23 of the budget document, it is stated that the budget includes \$415,000 for the agreement with the Fayetteville Regional Chamber of Commerce for economic development services, offset by a \$315,000 contribution from PWC (reflected as a cost redistribution). There has been recent discussion about restructuring current relationships and transitioning economic development activities to a different model. How will that impact the proposed budget for fiscal year 2016?
 - A. Staff is recommending that a short-term extension of the current contract for services provided by the Chamber's Economic Development Alliance be executed to provide services for six months following the conclusion of the current contract on June 30, 2015. This will allow time for City Council and staff to partner with Cumberland County and Alliance officials to determine the best structure to provide economic development services for the future.
