
# Fayetteville-Cumberland Parks and Recreation Project Proposal










### **Tennis Center**




- Current lack of tennis facility






## CAPE FEAR RIVER PARK

  - Cumberland County Schools

## **Options**



#### **Option 1**

- Dedicates 1.5 ¢ for 15 years / \$35,000,000 collected
- Projects: Multipurpose Aquatic Center w/Senior Center, 2
   Neighborhood Aquatic Centers, Tennis Center, River Park
- Provides 5 projects totaling \$30,600,000

#### Option 2

- Dedicates 1 ¢ for 15 years / \$24,000,000 collected
- Projects: Multipurpose Aquatic Center w/Senior Center, 2
   Neighborhood Aquatic Centers, Tennis Center (reduced size and scope)
- Provides 4 projects totaling \$21,600,000

#### Option 3

- Dedicates .5 ¢ for 15 years / \$12,000,000 collected
- Provides 4 projects totaling \$10,650,000
- Projects: stand-alone Senior Center, 2 Neighborhood Aquatic Centers, Tennis Center
