Mayor Robertson called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

Ms. Rebecca Rogers-Carter, Strategic Performance Analytics Director, appeared before Council and advised that staff proposed to revamp the Intergovernmental Affairs Program under the City Manager's office and that Mr. Andrew Holland, Assistant to the City Manager, would be managing the Intergovernmental Affairs Program. She advised staff had received proposals for state and federal lobbyists and based on the responses, staff proposed Capital City Strategies, the state lobbyist, for a 12-month period with a specific work plan and deliverables. The federal lobbyist would be Strategies, Inc., for 9 months, assuming that the County is a partner. Consensus of Council was to move forward.
