

Special Meeting
City Council - Fayetteville, N. C.
March 24, 1960

A special meeting of the City Council was held in the City Hall at 2:30 p.m., March 24, 1960.

The City Council received from the proper election officers the returns of the results of a Special Bond election held on March 22, 1960.

The said returns having been canvassed by the election officers, Councilman Massei introduced the following resolution which was read:

RESOLUTION DETERMINING THE RESULT OF THE
SPECIAL BOND ELECTION HELD ON MARCH 22,
1960, AND DECLARING THE RESULT THEREOF

BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Fayetteville:

Section 1. That, the returns of the special bond election held in the City of Fayetteville on March 22, 1960, having been received from the proper election officers and having been canvassed, the City Council has found and determined and does hereby declare:

(a) That the registrars and judges for the special bond election held in the City of Fayetteville on March 22, 1960, were duly qualified by law and had taken the necessary oath.

(b) That said election officers incorporated in their returns not only the number of votes cast for and against each question submitted but also the number of voters registered and qualified to vote in each precinct in the election.

(c) That no complaints have been made to the City Council against the regularity of said election.

(d) That at said election there were submitted to the qualified voters of said City the following questions:

1. Shall an ordinance passed on January 27, 1960, authorizing the City of Fayetteville, North Carolina, to contract a debt, in addition to any and all other debt which said City may now or hereafter have power or authority to contract, and in evidence thereof to issue Street Improvement Bonds in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$650,000 for the purpose of providing funds for constructing or reconstructing the surface of streets in said City, including the contemporaneous construction or reconstruction of sidewalks, curbs, gutters, drains and grading and the acquisition of necessary land and rights of way, at least two-thirds of the cost of which improvements, exclusive of the cost of paving at street intersections, is to be specially assessed, such bonds to be in addition to the \$220,000 Street Improvement Bonds authorized by an ordinance passed on July 13, 1959, and authorizing the levy and collection of a sufficient tax for the payment of the principal of and the interest on said bonds, be approved?
2. Shall an ordinance passed on January 27, 1960, authorizing the City of Fayetteville, North Carolina, to contract a debt, in addition to any and all other debt which said City may now or hereafter have power or authority to contract, and in evidence thereof to issue Fire Station Bonds in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$100,000 for the purpose of providing funds, with any other available funds, for erecting and equipping fire stations in said City, including the acquisition of necessary land, and authorizing the levy and collection of a sufficient tax for the payment of the principal of and the interest on said bonds, be approved?
3. Shall an ordinance passed on January 27, 1960, authorizing the City of Fayetteville, North Carolina, to contract a debt, in addition to any and all other debt which said City may now or hereafter have power or authority to contract, and in evidence thereof to issue Water Bonds in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$750,000 for the purpose of providing funds, with any other available funds, for enlarging and extending the waterworks system of said City, including the acquisition and construction of additional water storage, treatment and distribution facilities and the acquisition of necessary land, rights of way and equipment, and authorizing the levy and collection of a sufficient tax for the payment of the principal of and the interest on said bonds, be approved?

4. Shall an ordinance passed on January 27, 1960, authorizing the City of Fayetteville, North Carolina, to contract a debt, in addition to any and all other debt which said City may now or hereafter have power or authority to contract, and in evidence thereof to issue Sanitary Sewer Bonds in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$750,000 for the purpose of providing funds, with any other available funds, for enlarging and extending the sanitary sewer system of said City, including the acquisition and construction of additional sewage collection and outfall and other disposal facilities and the acquisition of necessary land, rights of way and equipment, and authorizing the levy and collection of a sufficient tax for the payment of the principal of and the interest on said bonds, be approved?

5. Shall an ordinance passed on January 27, 1960, authorizing the City of Fayetteville, North Carolina, to contract a debt, in addition to any and all other debt which said City may now or hereafter have power or authority to contract, and in evidence thereof to issue Recreation Facilities Bonds in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$250,000 for the purpose of providing funds, with any other available funds, for constructing and equipping recreation facilities and all buildings and structures necessary or useful in connection therewith, including the acquisition of land therefor, and authorizing the levy and collection of a sufficient tax for the payment of the principal of and the interest on said bonds, be approved?

Section 2. That the following schedule correctly shows the designations of the precincts and polling places at which said election was held, the number of voters registered and qualified to vote in each precinct, the number of votes cast in favor of each question submitted, the number cast against each question, and the totals of such numbers:
