The regular meeting of the City Council was held in the City Hall at 8 p.m. on February 8, 1960.

Councilman Massei introduced the following resolution which was read:

RESOLUTION CALLING A SPECIAL BOND ELECTION

BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Fayetteville:

Section 1. That a special bond election is hereby called to be held on Tuesday, March 22, 1960, between 6:30 A.M. and 6:30 P.M., Eastern Standard Time, at which there will be submitted to the qualified voters of said City the following questions:

1. Shall an ordinance passed on January 27, 1960, authorizing the City of Fayetteville, North Carolina, to contract a debt, in addition to any and all other debt which said City may now or hereafter have power or authority to contract, and in evidence thereof to issue Street Improvement Bonds in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$650,000 for the purpose of providing funds for constructing or reconstructing the surface of streets in said City, including the contemporaneous construction or reconstruction of sidewalks, curbs, gutters, drains and grading and the acquisition of necessary land and rights of way, at least two-thirds of the cost of which improvements, exclusive of the cost of paving at street intersections, is to be specially assessed, such bonds to be in addition to the \$220,000 Street Improvement Bonds authorized by an ordinance passed on July 13, 1959, and authorizing the levy and collection of a sufficient tax for the payment of the principal of and the interest on said bonds, be approved?
2. Shall an ordinance passed on January 27, 1960, authorizing the City of Fayetteville, North Carolina, to contract a debt, in addition to any and all other debt which said City may now or hereafter have power or authority to contract, and in evidence thereof to issue Fire Station Bonds in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$100,000 for the purpose of providing funds, with any other available funds, for erecting and equipping fire stations in said City, including the acquisition of necessary land, and authorizing the levy and collection of a sufficient tax for the payment of the principal of and the interest on said bonds, be approved?
3. Shall an ordinance passed on January 27, 1960, authorizing the City of Fayetteville, North Carolina, to contract a debt, in addition to any and all other debt which said City may now or hereafter have power or authority to contract, and in evidence thereof to issue Water Bonds in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$750,000 for the purpose of providing funds, with any other available funds, for enlarging and extending the waterworks system of said City, including the acquisition and construction of additional water storage, treatment and distribution facilities and the acquisition of necessary land, rights of way and equipment, and authorizing the levy and collection of a sufficient tax for the payment of the principal of and the interest on said bonds, be approved?
4. Shall an ordinance passed on January 27, 1960, authorizing the City of Fayetteville, North Carolina, to contract a debt, in addition to any and all other debt which said City may now or hereafter have power or authority to contract, and in evidence thereof to issue Sanitary Sewer Bonds in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$750,000 for the purpose of providing funds, with any other available funds, for enlarging and extending the sanitary sewer system of said City, including the acquisition and construction of additional sewage collection and outfall and other disposal facilities and the acquisition of necessary land, rights of way and equipment, and authorizing the levy and collection of a sufficient tax for the payment of the principal of and the interest on said bonds, be approved?
5. Shall an ordinance passed on January 27, 1960, authorizing the City of Fayetteville, North Carolina, to contract a debt, in addition to any and all other debt which said City may now or hereafter have power or authority to contract, and in evidence thereof to issue Recreation Facilities Bonds in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$250,000 for the purpose of providing funds, with any other available funds, for constructing and equipping recreation facilities and all buildings and structures necessary or useful in connection therewith, including the acquisition of land therefor, and authorizing the levy and collection of a sufficient tax for the payment of the principal of and the interest on said bonds, be approved?

Section 2. That for said election the regular registration books for elections in Cumberland County shall be used, and the registration books, process or records shall be opened for the registration of voters and for public inspection in the manner and under the conditions and at the times and places set forth in the Notice of Special Bond Election hereinafter provided for. For said election the registrars and judges appointed by the County Board of Elections shall act as registrars and judges respectively.

Section 3. That a notice of said election shall be published in the Fayetteville Observer at least thirty days before the date hereinabove fixed for said election, and again not later than twenty days before such date, reading substantially as follows:

A special bond election will be held on Tuesday, March 22, 1960, between 6:30 A.M. and 6:30 P.M., Eastern Standard Time, at which there will be submitted to the qualified voters of the City of Fayetteville the following questions:

1. Shall an ordinance passed on January 27, 1960, authorizing the City of Fayetteville, North Carolina, to contract a debt, in addition to any and all other debt which said City may now or hereafter have power or authority to contract, and in evidence thereof to issue Street Improvement Bonds in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$650,000 for the purpose of providing funds for constructing or reconstructing the surface of streets in said City, including the contemporaneous construction or reconstruction of sidewalks, curbs, gutters, drains and grading and the acquisition of necessary land and rights of way, at least two-thirds of the cost of which improvements, exclusive of the cost of paving at street intersections, is to be specially assessed, such bonds to be in addition to the \$220,000 Street Improvement Bonds authorized by an ordinance passed on July 13, 1959, and authorizing the levy and collection of a sufficient tax for the payment of the principal of and the interest on said bonds, be approved?
2. Shall an ordinance passed on January 27, 1960, authorizing the City of Fayetteville, North Carolina, to contract a debt, in addition to any and all other debt which said City may now or hereafter have power or authority to contract, and in evidence thereof to issue Fire Station Bonds in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$100,000 for the purpose of providing funds, with any other available funds, for erecting and equipping fire stations in said City, including the acquisition of necessary land, and authorizing the levy and collection of a sufficient tax for the payment of the principal of and the interest on said bonds, be approved?
3. Shall an ordinance passed on January 27, 1960, authorizing the City of Fayetteville, North Carolina, to contract a debt, in addition to any and all other debt which said City may now or hereafter have power or authority to contract, and in evidence thereof to issue Water Bonds in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$750,000 for the purpose of providing funds, with any other available funds, for enlarging and extending the waterworks system of said City, including the acquisition and construction of additional water storage, treatment and distribution facilities and the acquisition of necessary land, rights of way and equipment, and authorizing the levy and collection of a sufficient tax for the payment of the principal of and the interest on said bonds, be approved?
4. Shall an ordinance passed on January 27, 1960, authorizing the City of Fayetteville, North Carolina, to contract a debt, in addition to any and all other debt which said City may now or hereafter have power or authority to contract, and in evidence thereof to issue Sanitary Sewer Bonds in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$750,000 for the purpose of providing funds, with any other available funds, for enlarging and extending the sanitary sewer system of said City, including the acquisition and construction of additional sewage collection and outfall and other disposal facilities and acquisition of necessary land, rights of way and equipment, and authorizing the levy and collection of a sufficient tax for the payment of the principal of and the interest on said bonds, be approved?
5. Shall an ordinance passed on January 27, 1960, authorizing the City of Fayetteville, North Carolina, to contract a debt, in addition to any and all other debt which said City may now or hereafter have power or authority to contract, and in evidence thereof to issue Recreation Facilities Bonds in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$250,000 for the purpose of providing funds, with any other available funds, for constructing and equipping recreation facilities and all buildings and structures necessary or useful in connection therewith, including the acquisition of land therefore, and authorizing the levy and collection of a sufficient tax for the payment of the principal of and the interest on said bonds, be approved?

Each of the questions hereinabove set forth contains a statement of the purpose for which the bonds are authorized by the ordinance referred to in such question.
